Treasurer's Report

The President said the RSA's investments remain sound, under the guidance of the Financial Advisory Subcommittee. There have been no unusual transactions to bring to the attention of

Members. She foreshadowed that Members should expect a decrease in the Society's invested funds over the next 12 months, as we draw down on them to pay for our full time employee. However, over the next few years we will be focusing on increasing donations and instituting a bequest campaign to ensure the Society's financial basis remains firm.

4. Election of a Committee

Chris Fotinopoulos resigned from the board in January 2017, due to the pressure of work commitments, creating a casual vacancy on the Committee of Management. In accordance with 57 (a) of the RSA Rules, the Committee appointed Robbie van Dijk to the casual vacancy.

Rohan Kapitany and Tristram Chellew chose not to renominate for the Committee for 2018.

President's Report 2017

The most important and exciting development of the past year has been the employment of the RSA's first full time, paid Executive Officer. Tosca Lloyd joined us in June 2017, fresh from five years in London, where she was among the first cohort of students at AC Grayling's New College of the Humanities. Having graduated from the College with a first class honours philosophy degree, Tosca went on to complete a Masters degree in Human Rights at University College London before returning to Australia. Tosca has already made a major difference to the RSA's campaigns and behind-the-scenes administration and we look forward to her raising the RSA's public profile to become the go-to voice for secularism in Australia.

Campaigns

Last year the board invested in a professionally facilitated strategic planning workshop. As a result, we chose four campaigns to focus on for the year. And, there were the usual *ad hoc* campaigns we supported as well.

Sensible drug law reform

During 2016-17, the Victorian parliament conducted an inquiry into drug law reform and the RSA made a significant submission to it. While there are many other organisations with deeper knowledge of this field than us (eg, the long standing group *Family and Friends for Drug Law Reform*), our submission focused on the irrationality of continuing the failed policy of drug prohibition. Of recent months, we have been actively collaborating with a range of groups calling for the trial of a medically supervised injecting centre to help curb the alarming increase in drug-related deaths in Melbourne.

Body integrity

RSA Vice President Jonathan Meddings, and colleague Travis Wisdom from South Australia, authored an RSA White Paper on Genital Autonomy, which was professionally printed by the RSA and distributed widely to politicians and interest groups. Jonathan and Travis presented their paper at the Humanist Convention during the year, to great acclaim. Travis and his PhD supervisor also had a paper on non-consensual, medically unnecessary male circumcision published in the well-respected online daily *The Conversation*, which mentioned the RSA.

Rationalist curriculum

After previous successful lobbying, the Victorian Government has introduced a new F-10 curriculum called "Learning about Worldviews", which covers the five major world religions *and* secular humanism/rationalism. The RSA has kept in close contact with the relevant bureaucrat in charge of this initiative and we commissioned Monash University curriculum expert Dr David Zyngier to contribute the 'rationalism' aspect to the first lessons being developed.

The Irrationals

Work has continued preparing for a new award to be called The Irrationals, with a launch due next year.

Dying with Dignity

Following the year-long Victorian parliament inquiry into End of Life Choices, to which the RSA made a significant submission, we have been campaigning actively in collaboration with Dying with Dignity Victoria to ensure RSA members contact their local MPs to urge a favourable vote when the draft legislation is debated in the parliament. After decades of overwhelming public support, this is the best chance yet for positive reform.

Census

The results of the 2016 census were released mid-year and the RSA was prominent among those celebrating the significant increase in the number of Australians positively choosing "No Religion".

The Reason Project

Conscious that the RSA has a mission to educate the public about the benefits of rationalism, over the past year we have been working on a new website called the Reason Project. RSA member James Fodor has contributed a significant amount of content to this website, explaining for an interested lay audience, epistemology (what is knowledge), aspects of evidence, and logical reasoning.

Communications

Media articles

Around 20 articles written by RSA board members have been published in the mainstream media, on topic ranging from secular education and scripture, to scientology and Santa. Check them out on our website.

Public meetings

The Rationalist Think Tank monthly meetings have continued with around 15 attendees at each meeting. Thanks to RSA member Peter Sabatino, similar meetings have been trialled in Perth, WA.

Australian Rationalist Journal

We continue to publish the *Australian Rationalist* on a quarterly basis under the editorship of professional journalist David James. The last year featured cover stories on the modern relevance of the ancient philosophy of Stoicism; controversial advocate for Western liberal values, Ayaan Hirsi Ali; an analysis of the modern challenge to the authority of experts; and the emerging confrontation between America and China.

RSA Daily

Our daily curated bulletin RSA Daily continues to attract subscribers, up 10% (from 423 to 466) with the number of views up more than 20% (from 35 000 views to 43 000).

Website

The RSA's new Executive Officer has updated the website to make it more intuitive and friendly for readers.

Social media

The RSA maintains a Twitter, Facebook and LinkedIn presence, with updates on a daily basis.

Occasional emails

And we sent out 29 occasional newsletters during the year (last year 25).

Administration

The RSA Board has met every two months during the year, with the Financial Advisory Committee and the Editorial Committee meeting on a quarterly basis.

Investments

The Society's funds continue to be governed by a Financial Advisory Committee, comprising the President, the Treasurer and the RSA's *pro bono* Accountant, plus two professionally qualified independent experts, reporting to the main Committee. Following a prudent 'passive' investment policy, our funds have grown steadily over the past year.

Members should note that during the 2017-18 financial year, we are likely to see a decrease in the amount of funds invested, as we draw down to pay for our full time Executive Officer and the lease on a shared office space in Melbourne's CBD. However, over the following few years we will be mounting campaigns to restore these funds through donations and bequests to ensure we maintain a healthy financial foundation.

The Board

Thanks and appreciation are due to long time Board member Rohan Kapitany, who tried valiantly to maintain his connection to the board from Oxford, where he has a three year post-doc appointment, but who finally gave in to the tyranny of distance; and to Chris Fotinopoulos, who moved from Melbourne to Ballarat and also withdraw due to the pressure of work and distance and TJ Chellew. We welcomed Robbie van Dijk to the board during the year, filling the casual vacancy left when Chris withdrew.

Notes of the Financial Statements

Rationalist Society of Australia Inc. For the year ended 30 June 2017

Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act Victoria. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity as there are no users dependent on the general purpose financial statements.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

Income Tax

The Rationalist Society of Australia Inc is a registered organisation with the Australian Charities and Not-For-Profits Commission (ACNC). The committee has completed the "Endorsement review worksheet for income tax exempt charities" and concluded that no change in the eligibility criteria occurred during the 2017 financial year or in the subsequent months after year end.

Having satisfied the eligibility criteria of a Tax Concession Charity (TCC) as prescribed by the Australian Taxation Office (ATO), the financial reports for the 2017 financial year have been prepared on a tax exempt basis

Employee Provisions

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee provisions have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result ofpast events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflowcan be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required tosettle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

Cash on Hand

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

These notes should be read in conjunction with the attached compilation report.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received.

Dividend and interest income are recognised on a cash basis.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time ofreceipt.

Financial Assets

Investments in financial assets are initially recognised at cost, which includes transaction costs, and are subsequently measured at fair value, which is equivalent to their market bid price at the end of the reporting period. Movements in fair value are recognised through an equity reserve.
